A PROFILE OF THE NEW PRESIDENT

Alladin Hashim was born in Kuala Lumpur on the 4th of February, 1939. He had his early education at the Victoria Institution. He enrolled at the University of Malaya in 1960 on a Shell Scholarship and obtained a Degree in Agricultural Science four years later.

He took an active part in student politics within the university and abroad. He was the President of the University of Malaya Agricultural Graduates Alumni, the Vice-President of the University of Malaya Students Union and the President of the Agricultural Institute of Malaysia.

Presently, he is the President of the Commonwealth Association of Scientific Agricultural Societies (CASAS).

He joined FELDA In 1964 as an Agricultural Officer cum Planning Officer. However, his initial career in FELDA was interrupted as shortly after, he was awarded a Fullbright Scholarship to pursue his studies in the United States in 1965.

Again, during his days abroad, Alladin participated actively in student activites. For his previous role and exposure on international student movement and his leadership, he was elected President of the International Club of the University of Massachusetts for the 1965-1966 session. He instituted the Club's ideal of creating



better understanding amongst students of the world.

After obtaining a Masters Degree in Agricultural Economics in 1967, he resumed his career with FELDA. In recognition of his outstanding performance he was entrusted to lead FELDA as its Director General in 1979, a post he currently holds.

Being the Director General of FELDA, which is the forerunner in producing Malaysia's oil palm and rubber, he was appointed to the various boards of public agricultural agencies including The Palm Oil Research Institute of Malaysia (PORIM), the Malaysian Oil Palm Growers' Council (MOPGC) and The Malaysian Rubber Research and Development Board (MRRDB).

Recognizing his outstanding contribution to the success of the land development programme, which has helped to better the life of the poor in rural areas, Alladin Hashim was bestowed a Federal Award and four State Awards. He also received FELDA Gold Medal (First Class) Award in 1975.

In his spare time, Alladin is a "part-time" farmer on his small piece of land just opposite Kuala Lumpur. Occasionally, he plays golf to relax.
